

Social Work, Algoma University (Timmins, ON)

Algoma University ([www.algomau.ca](http://www.algomau.ca)) has a special mission “to be a teaching-oriented university that provides programs in the liberal arts and sciences and professional programs, primarily at the undergraduate level, with a particular focus on the needs of Northern Ontario, and to cultivate cross-cultural learning between Aboriginal communities and other communities, in keeping with the history of Algoma University and its geographic site.”

Algoma University invites applications for a 2-year limited-term appointment at the level of Lecturer or Assistant Professor; the anticipated start date is **December 3, 2018**. The successful candidate will be expected to teach Social Work courses at Algoma University’s Timmins, Ontario, extension, which is located in the Northern College of Applied Arts and Technology. The successful candidate must hold an earned PhD in Social Work or in a cognate discipline. Applicants nearing completion of a PhD will also be considered for this position. In all cases the incumbent must hold at least one degree in Social Work. The candidate should possess teaching expertise in generalist practice from an anti-oppressive, Indigenous, feminist, and structural social work perspective, and have teaching expertise in one or more of the following areas: working with individuals, families and groups, social work research, policy analysis and development, community development, and human behavior in the environment. The candidate should also display respect and sensitivity towards Anishinaabe, Cree and Metis Peoples. Knowledge and understanding of Anishinaabe, Cree and Metis cultures, traditions and the Seven Grandfather Teachings will be an asset. Preference will be given to those with a demonstrated commitment to undergraduate teaching and research.

Candidates should submit electronically: a letter of application, a current CV, a statement of teaching philosophy and evidence of teaching effectiveness (e.g., examples of student evaluations), evidence of research activity/engagement, to Dr. Donna M. Applicants must also arrange for three letters of reference to be sent electronically. The PDF file and reference letters should have file names that identify the applicant. Applications received by **Friday, November 9, 2018 at 4 pm.**, will be assured of consideration, though the posting remains open until the position is filled. We appreciate all interest in the position; however only short-listed candidates will be contacted. The position is subject to budgetary approval.
