KEYNOTE EVENTS

Northern Ontario Business Case Competition

The Northern Ontario Business Case Competition is an annual event that has students from across Ontario come together for this intense one-day event in which they are given an unknown business case, overhead transparencies, markers, and calculators. With no access to electronics or internet, these students are isolated in a room for three hours where they must prepare a thorough solution to the business case which is then presented to a panel of judges comprised of local and regional business professionals. After the presentations, the judges evaluate the teams' solutions and are free to challenge the students with questions or concerns.
